The Inspiring Summers program this year helped students gain 1.5 months of literacy skills and .5 months in math skills. FoFCL Youth Committee Engages the Foster City Community!

The Friends of the Foster City Library Youth Committee, rejuvenated in spring of this year, is composed of seven teens representing Aragon, Hillsdale and San Mateo High Schools. Katie Yue and Kyle Jiang chair the committee with volunteers Nia Balan, Alex Carreon, Sanjay Mukhyala, Nandita Paranjape, Rishika Sahu and adult advisor Susan Hall.

The committee plans a wide variety of activities to engage teens in cultural, educational, and entertaining programs throughout the coming year, both in-person and virtual. On June 18, they held a "Kick-off" event at the library, providing visitors with flyers describing the Youth Committee's goals and plans, in addition to playing games with visitors of all ages to learn more

about the group's goals and events. In August, Evan Rose, President of San Mateo High School's Investment Club, led a group of over 20 Foster City teens and adults in an hour and a half seminar teaching the basics of finance. Finally, the Youth Committee hosted a "Hallo-Teen Hangout" on October 26, a fun craft event to celebrate the season and get to know Foster City youth.

The Youth Committee plans on hosting many more events, so we hope to see your teen or student soon! Included in the committee's list of possible future programs: a fun trivia contest with prizes, music performances by local teen performers, American Sign Language lessons, health and safety measures, "art day," author presentations, and more! 


